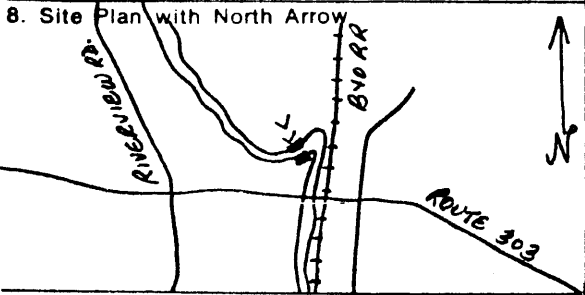

16. Further Description of Important Features Lock No. 29 and the abutments of the former canal aqueduct are both of cut stone construction. Lock is standard mitered gate type, measuring 90 X 15 feet within the lock chamber. Aqueduct was originally a two-span structure, acc. to Bishop. Center stone pier was removed when aqueduct was replaced with a single-span steel structure. The new aqueduct was destroyed by the great flood of 1913.	26. 17. History and Significance The Cuyahoga River makes a wide detour at the Village of Peninsula and comes back to within fifty feet of itself, forming a "peninsula." The Ohio and Erie Canal crossed the river at this point by means of an aqueduct--Bishop writes that it was a wooden trough with plank towpath--built upon arches of stone, the remains of which can still be seen.
