

Further Description of Important Features Queen Anne house with a projecting front gable containing a flared, shingled surface and a small architraved window; wide double-hung windows separated by a floor level belt-course; and an elaborate, double-story porch with two entrances, spindled posts, railings, and frieze. The porch also contains carved brackets. Interior wood-work of cherry, oak, and popular. Two later additions to the rear.		28. No. of Stories 2-1/2		
3. History and Significance This house was built at some point in the last decade of the 19th Century by J. Hershey. He was a local merchant noted for his parsimony, sleeping in a downstairs bedroom in order to protect his property from thieves. 
Dear Mrs. Reinbolt:
