

## Summit County Veterans' Burials Card File

ACCESSION #2007-63

LOCATION: 7 A 8

ACQUISITION: Lindy Lutz Cash donated this collection in October 2007.

ACCESS: Restricted access; materials fragile; access by request at Main Library Special Collections only.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: The card file of Summit County Veterans was created by the American Legion and maintained by the donor's grandfather, Raymond G. Lutz, of the Wendell Willkie Post. The purpose of the files was to record graves to be marked with flags for Memorial Day. After Raymond Lutz's death (23 Jan 1985), the records were in the possession of Robert W. Lutz (d. 31 Jan 2007).

SCOPE AND CONTENT: The collection consists of cards arranged by war and then alphabetically by the veteran's name. The wars are **not** filed in chronological order. Wars included are the Spanish-American War (1898), Revolutionary War (1775-1783), War of 1812 (1812-1814), and World War I (1914-1918). Only a few cards for Civil War Veterans are included in the collection. An "other" category was created for wars with very few burial cards. Information on the veteran cards include the veteran's name; the war in which the veteran served; cemetery; date of birth; date of death; date of funeral; date of enlistment; date of discharge; wartime outfit; and any additional remarks. Some cards in the collection were unfilled.

Cemetery burial lists for veterans in East Akron Cemetery, Copley, and other Summit County cemeteries are also part of the collection.
